

# LAKE CHARLES HARBOR & TERMINAL DISTRICT



**LOCATION** – Located in the southwest portion of the state, the Port District encompasses 203 square miles of Calcasieu Parish and accommodates 52 million tons of cargo annually according to the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers, ranking the Port of Lake Charles as the 11th busiest in the Nation.

**ORGANIZATION** – The Lake Charles Harbor & Terminal District was created by Act No. 67 of the 1924 regular session of the Louisiana Legislature. It is governed by a seven member Board of Commissioners. The District is authorized to call bond elections and to raise funds for the construction, operation, and maintenance of port facilities.

## CARGO TERMINALS & FACILITIES

City Docks: Port-Owned & Operated; General Cargo: Berths: 13; Length: 583 ft. avg. length; Depth: 36 ft. at 11 Berths, 40 ft. at 2 Berths; 1.6 million sq ft. of covered storage which is serviced by Rail.

Bulk Terminal 1: Port-Owned & Operated; Cargo: Dry Bulk; Berths: 1; Length: 2,200 ft. w/dolphins; Depth: 40 ft.; Rail Service; Two traveling ship/barge loaders (one at 2,000 tph and one at 3,200 tph), clam-bucket unloader (at 450 tph), 100-ton railcar rollover w/unloading rate of 1,200 tph.

## OTHER PORT-OWNED BUSINESSES, SERVICES AND FACILITIES

Industrial Canal: Located at the intersection of the Calcasieu Ship Channel and the U.S. Gulf Intracoastal Waterway; 22.4 miles north of the U.S. Gulf of Mexico; 220 acres of developable property on the waterfront; 3 miles long and has a 1,400 by 1,400-foot turning basin at its east end.

Industrial Properties available for industrial development: Industrial Park East: Located one-half mile south of U.S. Interstate 10 on Louisiana State Highway 397 and has 325 acres available for development; rail spur on site with water and sewer lines and power. Westlake Property: 54 acres with water front, water and power on site and rail easements.
