

TERREBONNE PORT COMMISSION



LOCATION – The Port of Terrebonne is located on the Houma Navigation Canal less than .5 mile south of the U.S. Gulf Intracoastal Waterway with unlimited vertical clearance 30 miles to the U.S. Gulf of Mexico. In the community of Houma, Louisiana, the Port is less than one mile from the Houma-Terrebonne Airport and with good arteries to the 4 lane U.S. Highway 90.

ORGANIZATION – The Terrebonne Port Commission was created by Act No. 485 of the 1964 regular session of the Louisiana Legislature. It is governed by board of commissioners consisting of 7 members who serve for a 6-year term. A political subdivision of the State of Louisiana, the Commission governs the port site, makes policy, and has the responsibilities of all the waterways in Terrebonne Parish. They hire a Director to administer the Commission’s policies.
