

RED RIVER PARISH PORT COMMISSION



LOCATION – The fifty-acre Red River Parish Port site is located in Pool 4 at river mile 173.3 (from the Old River Lock on the Mississippi River).

The Port is located 0.5 miles from LA Highway 1, 4 miles from U.S. Highway 84, 7 miles from U.S. Highway 71 and 10 miles from U. S. Interstate 49

ORGANIZATION – The Red River Parish Port Commission was created by Act No. 294 of the 1975 regular session of the Louisiana Legislature. The port was established to regulate the commerce and traffic within the port area, consisting of the entire parish. It is governed by a seven-member board of commissioners who serve six-year terms. Two members are appointed by the Town of Coushatta, two by the Red River Parish Police Jury and three by the Governor.
